

## Adler Institute: Comprehensive Activity Report September 2024

### Emergency Response and Rehabilitation Program

The Adler Institute continues to operate its Emergency Response and Rehabilitation Program to support victims of the October 2023 tragedy. As time progresses, we've adapted our services to meet evolving needs.

#### **Parental Guidance and Support:**

##### 1. Evacuees Support:

- Guidance for southern evacuees returning home
- Digital guidance, discussion meetings, and parent groups for northern evacuees
- Collaboration with Hof Ashkelon Resilience Center, Tiberias and Kiryat Shmona welfare systems
- Approximately 1,200 hours of in-person and online parental guidance
- Over 50 group parental guidance sessions

##### 2. Digital Outreach:

- 12,000 parents receiving ongoing information and content via WhatsApp groups
- Approximately 500 individual phone consultations
- Over 150 lectures on various topics, reaching about 5,000 parents

#### **Treatment Clinic:**

- Ongoing support for reserve soldiers, evacuees from Gaza envelope and northern settlements
- 25 additional Adlerian psychotherapists recruited
- Over 300 hours of therapy provided

#### **Support for Reserve Soldiers:**

- Parental guidance/couple and individual therapy for over 600 reserve soldiers and their partners
- Support groups during refresher days, in collaboration with relevant authorities in the Ministry of Defense

#### **Widows and Widowers Support:**

- Collaboration with "Maatefet" organization for civilian widows and orphans
- In contact with the IDF Widows and Orphans Organization, but funding has not yet been secured for this initiative



### **Challenges:**

- Complex and increasing needs as the conflict continues
- Unique expertise required, not available through other services
- Families experiencing fatigue and complex situations as months pass
- Donations have ceased, putting the Emergency Response Program at risk of closure

### **Impact:**

The Adler Institute continues to play a crucial role in supporting families, soldiers, and communities affected by the ongoing conflict. Our services provide a space for sharing, strengthening, and connecting to inner resources, helping to alleviate the ongoing extreme situation.

Additional funding is urgently needed to maintain and expand these vital services, ensuring continued support for the many families who have lost so much. Without new funding, we face the potential closure of our Emergency Response Program, which would leave many vulnerable individuals and families without crucial support.
